A Note Regarding UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Contest

Dear Families of the Vines High School Music Department,

Last semester was a testament to the resilience of our students and community. While our students rose to the challenges of learning and performing music at a distance, we, as teachers, were stretched to find creative ways to engage students and continue challenging their musical and personal growth.

In hopes to remain fully transparent with you, while UIL has revised standards and protocols for the 2021 contest season, the following challenges remain for us:

- 1. **Adequate rehearsal space**: The only spaces that can sufficiently house each ensemble while observing social distancing protocol at Vines High School are the gym and the cafeteria, both of which are prioritized for Theatre and Athletic events.
- 2. Adequate rehearsal time: In the current configuration of class delivery, we will regularly hear in-person students twice per week and online students who opt to attend in-person rehearsals outside of the school day once per week. While this is adequate for preparing music significantly easier than is appropriate for each student's level of development, we should consider the value of preparing music for a contest for the sake of a contest. Our limited rehearsal time would be better spent preparing an appropriately advanced repertoire and finding creative ways to develop the TEKS for our students.
- 3. Adequate instrumentation and personnel: Regardless of the level of difficulty of literature, we will continue to be affected, as Marching Band was in the fall, by quarantined students. In a marching band, every part is doubled and tripled, whereas in our smaller concert ensembles, even one missing student could greatly affect performance. Additionally, entire sections of our concert ensembles are online-only, limiting the repertoire we would be able to perform. Preparation for an indoor, off-campus stage performance is not feasible to many of our families, and we would like to offer equitable opportunities for growth and performance to every student in our program.

In place of preparing for a traditional contest season, we will be delivering a more in-depth chamber music curriculum during the first half of the spring semester, before beginning preparations for a community-oriented final spring concert. This will allow us the opportunity to use the cafeteria and outdoor facilities to hold rehearsals outside of the school day in more favorable weather.

While we are disappointed that the current circumstances do not allow us to compete, we are grateful for the multitude of safe performance opportunities available to our students.

Thank you for your continued support, and thank you to our incredible administrators for consistently work to advocate for our programs and students.
